Yates Electrospace Corporation signs development contract with U.S. Special Operations Command for 1-ton Silent Arrow autonomous cargo UAV.

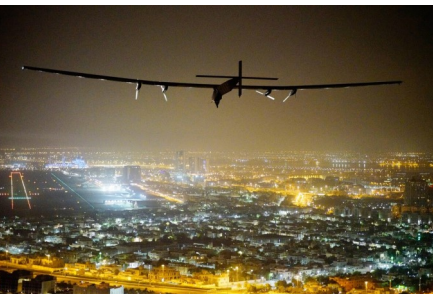
